The average shampoo is 35 per cent "surfactants" – or wetting agents – and there is a huge variety of these, says Craig Jones. "They can be petroleum-based, such as SLS, or made using natural oils such as coconut or glucose." He says the chemical make-up of natural surfactants is different to petroleum-based products.

If you switch from a chemical to a natural product, allow four or five washes for your hair to detox.
